

Awards Information

Te Tango Raumaire o Avaiki is the first ever legislated national awards system of the Cook Islands, established in 2025 to coincide with our 60 years of self-governance. It is a uniquely Cook Islands way of recognising service, leadership, innovation, bravery and achievement.

Who can be nominated?

- Current residents of the Cook Islands (18 years and over).
- Exceptional cases: bravery awards may include non-residents, visitors, or those under 18.
- Nominees must be of good ethical standing.

Who can nominate?

- Any Cook Islands resident, organisation, or community group.
- You cannot nominate yourself.

Award categories:

CATEGORY	NAME OF AWARD	WHAT IT RECOGNISES
Grand Awards (Te Mira Nui o Avaiki)	Tui o te Mira Nui o Avaiki (for men)/ Tapairu o te Mira Nui o Avaiki (for women)	The highest honour – awarded once every six years for once-in-a-generation contributions of national and historicalsignificance. Recognises lifetime leadership, exemplary character, and enduring impact.
	Akatauira o te Mira Nui o Avaiki	Exceptional service, leadership and innovation of national importance. Conferred every two years.
	Pūtokotoko o te Mira Nui o Avaiki	Commendable service and leadership of a high standard across any field. Conferred every two years.
Premier Awards	Rei Ārangatū o Avaiki	Outstanding contribution to the Public Service, demonstrating leadership, innovation or reform that improves government credibility and service delivery.
	Ētū Matariki o Avaiki	The Star of Excellence, awarded for significant contributions in: Social Impact & Sports; Arts, Culture & Humanities; Business, Science Innovation; or Environment & Conservation.
	Reinga Toa o Avaiki	The Seal of Distinction – awarded for acts of absolute heroism, bravery or gallantry, including to non-residents and visitors.
	Taiki Pāeru o Te-Atukura	The Prime Minister's Leadership Mace – a discretionary award for extraordinary achievements not otherwise covered.

 - 1–2 page supporting statement
 - At least one letter of support (recommended more)
